### **Good News for Deople In Need!**

The offering for PIN at the DACU Thanksgiving Eve Service totaled to \$ 2,250.00. This is an increase of \$902.00 or 67% over last year's amount (\$1,348.00) and is the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest collection in the last 7 years. What a tremendous response from Dubuque's faith community!

P.I.N. Treasurer Tom Stovall reported that he received a PIN donation check from the Sisters of the Presentation for \$5,000! Tom reports that is the largest donation that PIN has ever received. A couple days later, he got another check from them for \$250 which was the result of a collection from employees at Sisters of the Presentation. Then, a couple days after that, he got another check for \$155 which was from a collection among the staff of the administration department at Sisters of the Presentation. WOW! That is a total of \$5,405 from our good friends there. What a blessing for PIN and an outpouring of caring.

### **Opening Doors**Bed of Hope

Opening Doors has been a vital resource in the Dubuque community for over 11 years. Over 1,700 women have been provided a home with support services through Opening Doors' two programs, Maria House and Teresa Shelter. A year-round community fundraiser called "*Bed of Hope*" is offering a new opportunity for congregations, civic groups, colleges, and businesses to support women and children in the Dubuque area.

The idea is simple: Every year Opening Doors offers 16,790 beds for homeless women and children. (Currently the two facilities have a total of 46 beds.) Donors may support as many beds as they wish at \$10 per bed. The annual goal is to get all 46 beds covered for each night of the year.

### **Hello DACU members!**

I pray that each of you has had a blessed 2011. It is hard to believe a new year is creeping up on us already. Since so many of you have been involved in our Bridges Initiative work, I wanted to take a moment to give you a few updates.

**Getting Ahead:** Getting Ahead graduation ceremony was December 16 at the Holiday Inn Downtown in the Blue Moon Room. For so many of these 32 individuals, completing something is a concept they have not grasped-until now. The event was free and open to the public. Thanks to those who attended to show support of those folks who are moving forward in their lives.

**Circles:** We are making another Circles match tonight! This means we now have 5 dedicated Getting Ahead

grads who have decided to keep the momentum going and to reach their goals. Each of these Circle Leaders has 3-4 Community members who have agreed to stand beside them and support them as they move forward. So far, one matched Circle has helped their Circle Leader (Getting Ahead grad) write a business plan to start her own bakery, another has supported their Circle Leader through some tough emotional times and encouraged them to not give up. And yet another has helped a Circle Leader get her drivers licence. Good Stuff! Please feel free to join us any Tuesday night (except Jan 3rd, 2012) to see what is going on. You do not have to make any commitment at that time-just check us out. We eat a community meal at 5:45 and meet from 6:30-8:00 p.m. at Prescott School.

**Bridges Out of Poverty:** We will be hosting another full day event at Loras College in Mid March. As soon as the date is secured I will pass on the information.

I tell you-we have a lot going on...and we love every minute of it. When we hear the comments our participants (both those in poverty and those in middle class) make, we know we are on the right track and blessed to be doing the work.

I also wanted to issue a challenge. As I stated above, we have a community meal every Tuesday. We serve between 70-150 people each week depending on if a Getting Ahead class is currently in session. GracePoint Church has thrown down the gauntlet and committed to providing a meal every quarter for 2012 and has already booked their dates. Are there any other congregations who can say-Yes we can do 4 meals in 2012? Don't worry about date availability right now-we can put you in a date for the future and with enough advance notice can switch it if needed. What do you think-is your congregation up for the challenge?

February 23, 2012: Joseph/Yusuf. University of Dubuque, Dunlap Technology Building (Hadley Auditorium)


