DUBUQUE AREA MAKE A DIFFERENCE DAY 2012 "A NATIONAL DAY OF DOING GOOD FOR OTHERS" SATURDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2012

On Saturday, October 27th, volunteer teams will spread out across the Dubuque community in a one-day blitz to provide helping hand services to the homes of their elderly, disabled, veteran and low-income neighbors. Services may include both light-duty and heavy-duty chores around the home, curb appeal and yard work projects outside, socializing and playing games with homebound seniors, simple repairs, and weatherization activities such as caulking or applying window plastic. The goal of this sixth annual event is to provide100 homes with free helping and caring services.

Dubuque Area Congregations United (DACU) is again one of the official sponsors of this event and is encouraging all congregations to join in this important community outreach effort. Several congregations have participated over the past years. We hope to have even more congregations participate this year to show the power and caring spirit of our local religious community in doing good for others.

Congregations can participate in this much-needed project in three important ways.

- Recruit one or more volunteer teams to participate in the project on October 27th. Each team consists of 6 volunteers and will be asked to assist 2 homes that day. The work does not require a lot of skill and all materials will be provided to complete the job. We hope to have teams signed up by October 1st.
- Assist in identifying and referring households that could really use the volunteer services being provided. Again, the target homes are those of elderly, disabled, veterans and low-income neighbors. The planning committee will follow up with all homeowners referred by congregations. We hope to have homes identified by September 28th.
- Donate funds to assist with purchasing all of the supplies and materials that will be required to serve 100 homes. It will cost about \$50 per home. Donations may be sent to Operation: New View Community Action Agency, 1473 Central Avenue, Dubuque, IA 52001. Please indicate "Make A Difference Day" on checks. Donations are tax deductible.


