- --Valid picture ID
- --Social Security Cards for you and each member of your family included on your return
- --Birthdates for you and each member included on your return
- --W-2s for all jobs in 2011and any other tax related documents
- --1099 forms for other income, if any
- --A copy of last year's tax returns (federal and state)
- --If you are claiming childcare expenses, bring documentation of expenses and either the childcare agency's ID or the provider's Social Security number
- --All adults on your return must be present to sign forms
- --College tuition and student loan interest statements
- --A blank check if you want your refund direct deposited **Questions??**

Hospice of Dubuque will be sponsoring two sixweek bereavement support groups. They will be open to anyone in the tri-state area who has experienced the loss of a loved one, through death, within the past twelve months. It is suggested that participants wait at least three months after a loss before attending.

One group is scheduled to meet on Tuesday evenings from 6:30–8:30 pm, beginning February 21<sup>st</sup> and ending March 27<sup>th</sup>. The other group is scheduled to meet on Wednesday afternoons from 1–3 pm, beginning February 22<sup>nd</sup> and ending March 28<sup>th</sup>. The groups will meet at the Hospice of Dubuque office, in the Theisen Education Center, 1670 JFK Road. The sessions are meant to be both educational and emotionally supportive. There is no requirement to have had a previous connection with Hospice of Dubuque. Group size is limited so preregistration is required by February 14<sup>th</sup>.
