"Human trafficking is the trafficking of humans as modern-day slavery, involving victims being forced, defrauded, or coerced into sexual exploitation. Annually, it is estimated that almost 1,000,000 people, predominantly women & children, are trafficked legally & illegally across national borders to countries that do not recognize human trafficking within their own nation.

TIP-ID training is designed to raise up & equip workers and organizations from across the nation to take an active role in bringing about positive changes in the lives of children who have been victims of human trafficking...This training arms the attendees for action & enables them to make a difference for child victims of human trafficking." (WFM)

This training will include:

- 1) an overview of the business model of human trafficking and how it operates,
- 2) how to identify trafficking locations and people who are being trafficked,
- 3) a look at current laws that address human trafficking,
- 4) an 8-hour certification upon completion of training.
- \*\* All attendees are required to participate in the full 8 hour training in order to receive certification.
