Dubuque Downtown Christian Outreach (DDCO)

"Ghost People: Seeing All the People in Our Community"

The Homeless Awareness Action Group (HAAG) of the Dubuque Downtown Christian Outreach (DDCO), a group of downtown religious congregations, is

requesting funding to produce a short film, "Ghost People; Seeing All the People in Our Community".

This project is specifically aimed at strengthening non-profit shelters and the agencies working with the homeless, both financially and in terms of volunteer labor. HAAG anticipates presenting the film to at least 40 congregations and 20 civic and business groups. Specific suggestions as to how a person might respond to the needs of homeless people will depend upon the nature and circumstances of the group addressed. In addition the video will be used by any interested agency and will be shown on cable T.V.

Move To Amend

Those who attended the May DACU Meeting learned about the "Move to Amend". Formed in September 2009, Move to Amend is a coalition of hundreds of organizations and hundreds of thousands of individuals committed to social and economic justice, ending corporate rule, and building a vibrant democracy that is genuinely accountable to the people, not corporate interests.

The organization is calling for an amendment to the US Constitution to unequivocally state that inalienable rights belong to human beings only, and that money is not a form of protected free speech under the First Amendment and can be regulated in political campaigns.
