

Dubuque Downtown Christian Outreach (DDCO)

"Ghost People: Seeing All the People in Our Community"

The Homeless Awareness Action Group (HAAG) of the Dubuque Downtown Christian Outreach (DDCO), a group of downtown religious congregations, is requesting funding to produce a short film, "Ghost People; Seeing All the People in Our Community".

This project is specifically aimed at strengthening nonprofit shelters and the agencies working with the homeless, both financially and in terms of volunteer labor. HAAG anticipates presenting the film to at least 40 congregations and 20 civic and business groups. Specific suggestions as to how a person might respond to the needs of homeless people will depend upon the nature and circumstances of the group addressed. In addition the video will be used by any interested agency and will be shown on cable T.V.
