

St. Mark Youth Enrichment

St. Mark Seeks Sponsor Angels

Each holiday season, St. Mark Youth Enrichment coordinates their annual "Sponsor Angels" program. This program provides warm winter clothing for children in the organization's programs. St. Mark is inviting community friends and businesses to join the effort again this year. Individuals will be paired with children that qualify for the program, then these individuals, or Sponsor Angels, purchase the requested clothing items, and deliver them to St Mark Youth Enrichment offices located at 1201 Locust Street.

Those interested in serving as a Sponsor Angel this season are invited to contact St. Mark to register by November 6th. Beth McGorry, Outreach Coordinator, then provides Sponsor Angels with the first name, gender, age, and clothing sizes for one or more children by November 13th just in time for holiday shopping.

This year, due to high demand, St. Mark Youth Enrichment is hoping to register more Sponsor Angels than ever before. Children who qualify for Sponsor Angels are children in need who participate in before or after school programs, the St. Mark Summer Learning Program as well as the Dyersville Summer Learning Program. Students who receive free/reduced lunches will be given preference to meet the needs of those who need it most. Last year, 72% of the students in the before and after school programs, Early Risers and Step up, respectively, were served free/reduced lunches. This is the first year that students enrolled in the summer learning programs will also have an opportunity to participate.

Last year, St. Mark Youth Enrichment saw incredible community support and had more Sponsors than there were students in the program. To the delight of many families, this meant that siblings who were not yet school age or were in middle school and high school were able to participate as well. One parent left a note after she picked up the multiple boxes for her children that said, "Thank you so much, you gave my kids a Christmas!" The impact that this program has on children by providing basic, warm winter clothing is lasting enough to keep them warm the entire year.

If you are interested in sponsoring one or more children, but do not have time to shop, we have shoppers available. Please feel free to make your financial contribution and our shoppers will select gifts for your child. Likewise, if you are unable to make a financial gift, but are interested in volunteering as a shopper you can also do so, as there is always a large need in the community!


