The Health Insurance Marketplace has closed open enrollment as of April 30, 2015 and open enrollment will begin again on November 1, 2015. You may qualify for a Special Enrollment Period if you meet the following life changes such as:

- * Getting married, having a baby, adopting a child or placing a child for adoption or foster care, losing other health coverage (minimum essential coverage), permanently moving outside your plans coverage area, gaining citizenship or lawful presence in the U.S., gaining or continuing status as a member of an Indian Tribe or an Alaska Native shareholder or leaving incarceration.
- * For people already enrolled in Marketplace coverage, having a change in income or household status that affects eligibility for premium tax credits or cost-sharing reductions.

Hope House

Dear Friends,


I am writing to ask you to consider volunteering to prepare and serve a Community meal at Hope House. Hope House is a House of Hospitality formed in the philosophy of the Catholic Worker Movement, founded by Peter Maurin and Dorothy Day in the 1930s. We offer free food and lodging for single men, free meals for the community twice a week, welcome drop-in visitors daily from 10:00a to 8:00p, stock a free food pantry, and host round table discussions on a variety of topics twice a month.

As you may know, we serve Community Meals, to which all are invited, on Sunday and Monday evenings at 6:00p. About 25-35 people on average share in the meal.

Our Monday evening meals are provided by groups that do so every month. Loras College student groups generally serve the meals on Sundays, from October through April. We are in need of groups to serve on Sundays from June 22 through September 28.

The following Sundays are currently available: May 17, May 31, June 7, June 14, June 21, June 28, July 5, July 12, July 19, July 26, August 2, August 9, Aug 16, Aug 23, Aug 30, Sept 6, Sept 13, Sept 20, Sept 27.
