



Clarke University to Feature Immigration Film "ABRAZOS"
Thursday, March 5, 7:00 p.m.

Documentary filmmaker, Luis Argueta, will present his new film, ABRAZOS, the second in a trilogy of films on the issue of immigration on Thursday, March 5 at 7 p.m. in the Jansen Music Hall at Clarke University in Dubuque, Iowa. His first film, "abUSED, the Postville Raid" was presented at Clarke two years ago. ABRAZOS, Spanish for "hugs," tells the story of U.S. citizen children from Worthington, Minn., who traveled to Guatemala to see their grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins and siblings for the first time. After being separated for nearly two decades, these families reunite and share stories, strengthen traditions and begin to reconstruct their cultural identity.

Because they were born in the U.S., children of undocumented parents are entitled to the same rights and freedoms as all Americans; many have grown up with the fear of being separated from their parents through parental deportation. There are 4.5 million U.S. citizen children who are living with at least one undocumented parent. Because they have never met their grandparents or other family members, they do not

have a clear sense of who they are or of their heritage. ABRAZOS is the story of 14 of these children.

"ABRAZOS touches the heart and puts a human face on the issue of immigration," said Sr. Mary McCauley, BVM of Crossing Borders, Dubuque. "Its clear and soulstirring message has the power to transform hearts. In so doing, it has the potential to influence a change in current immigration policy."


Following the 45-minute screening there will be an opportunity for questions and answer facilitated by Argueta. A small reception will follow.

The screening is free and open to the public. There will be an opportunity to participate in a free-will offering to support future presentations of the film.

A public screening will also be held March 5 at 2:30 p.m. at the Clare House of the Sisters of St. Francis, 3340 Windsor Ave., in Dubuque.

Hope and Healing for Alzheimer's: A DVD Project

The Healing Moments Alzheimer's Ministry is raising funds to create a DVD of a dramatic performance of The Forgiving & The Forgetting that will be performed in Chicago in March, 2015. This original theatre performance, written by Dubuque residents Jade Angelica and Amy Ressler, depicts the journey into and through Alzheimer's as experienced by two siblings and their mother. Reflecting universal truths of this disease, The Forgiving & The Forgetting provides a spiritual lens for discovering meaning and purpose in the presence of the challenging realities of Alzheimer's. In addition, the performance demonstrates the importance of compassion for this vulnerable population, and teaches effective communication skills designed to enhance the lives of persons with Alzheimer's and dementia, their families, and their caregivers.

To raise funds to produce the DVD, a crowd funding campaign has been created on a site sponsored by the Unitarian Universalist Association: http://www.faithify.org/projects/forgiving-forgetting-hope-healing-alzheimers/

All donations are tax deductible, and those donating \$100 or more will receive a free DVD. The message of the play is about hope, healing, and transformation; it's about what remains for persons with dementia and those who love them, instead of what is lost. We anticipate that this theatre experience and DVD will plant consciousness-raising and hope-inspiring seeds in the hearts and minds of a substantial number of our audience members, and that they will carry this message to others in our communities through their words and actions. With the worldview-shifting insights found in The Forgiving and The Forgetting, this project could have a positive systemic impact on society.


