Source of Income and Other Ways of Meeting Housing Needs: Taking Action

Overcoming poverty is not a task of charity. It is an act of justice. Like slavery and Apartheid, poverty is not natural. It is man-made and it can be overcome and eradicated by actions of human beings. Sometimes it falls on generation to be great. You can be that great generation.

Ten Actions You Can Take

1. Advise the Mayor, City Council and the Department of Housing and Economic Development that you are concerned with the limited rental housing options available to participants in the voucher program (section 8). Let them know steps need to be taken so that more than 17% of landlords participate in offering rental housing.
2. Support a Voucher Ordinance that requires all landlords to participate in the voucher program.
3. Attend summer meeting on Sources of Income and rental housing. Contact Housing and Economic Development to learn the meeting dates <http://www.cityofdubuque.org/618/Housing-Community-Development>
4. Advise the Director of Housing and Community Development that you support the Community Development Block Grant Program and wish to be kept up-to-date
5. Advise the Director of Housing and Community Development that you support the Voluntary Compliance program with HUD and wish to see growth in Fair Housing including racial integration in housing in Dubuque
6. Express your willingness to meet with the Director of Housing and Community Development on a quarterly

basis. Join the Friends of the NAACP Housing Committee. Contact loguidice@fastmail.fm. to express your interest.

7. Contact the City of Dubuque initiatives in Housing-Human Rights Commission, Inclusive Dubuque. Ask them to work in concert with the Director of Housing and Community Development.

8. Ask other groups that you are a part of -E.G. Project Concern, Rescue Mission, Maria House, Habitat for Humanity, Landlords Association- to work in concert.

9. Let every group you contact know the nature of the problem (see the information sheets attached) and that the Dubuque Housing Problem is solvable. An additional 200-300 additional low income housing units would solve our problem.

10. Stress in every contact you make that low-income housing is an economic driver. Vouchers bring \$6 million a year in income to our community. Good housing is an attraction to newcomers and to inviting new business to Dubuque.

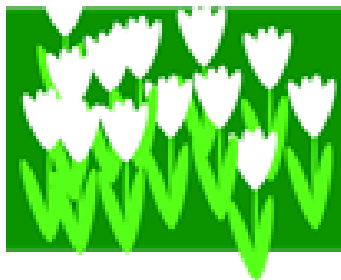

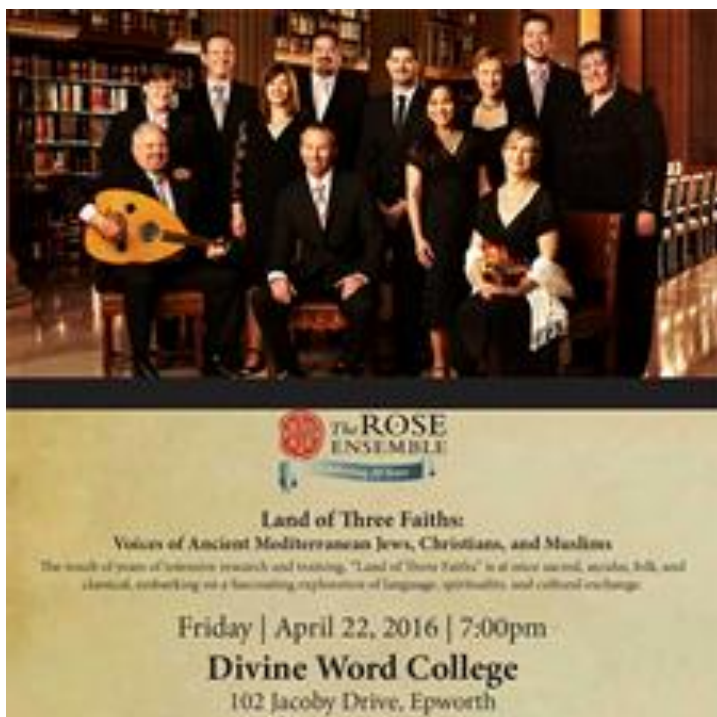
