



It was so good to see so many dedicated and thoughtful people of faith wanting to act together on climate change. Thanks to Carrie Lohrmann at Holy Trinity Lutheran for hosting and providing snacks!

### Recap

To recap this first meeting, we discussed the purpose of an IIPL Chapter, and the Chapter Agreement draft and with a few minor changes to the Agreement we all decided it would serve. The financial section will serve to begin with and as we have some experience with this we will revisit that section.

I welcome feedback as we go along over the course of a year, and would like to take some time at the six-month mark to revisit the Agreement to see how things are going and make adjustments if necessary.

### **Next Meeting**

The next meeting of the IIPL Dubuque Chapter will be held **Sunday**, **June 26**, **at 2pm-3:30pm** at St. Luke's United Methodist Church at 1199 Main St, Dubuque. Thanks to Mary Armstrong and Sue Hattel for offering to host!

At the next meeting we will:

- Choose a convener, someone to take notes, and any other roles you think you should have (perhaps a communications person)
- Discuss the "Chapter Planning Guidelines" (see link below)
- Brainstorm projects the group might like to work on
- If possible narrow it down to three project ideas and assign people to research the three ideas for feasibility and timeliness

Please come prepared to share your project ideas for the group to consider!

### Please REGISTER for the meeting.

Once a project is decided on and a plan created to carry it out, we can sign the Chapter Agreement. I hope we could be ready to sign the Agreement by the end of July or August.

### Purpose of an IIPL Chapter

The purpose of an IIPL Chapter would be to build the network of people of faith concerned about climate change and to deepen and strengthen the faith community's efforts in Dubuque to pursue solutions to climate change. This Chapter would be a citywide, faith-based, interfaith "green team" made up of members from local area congregations and religious organizations. It would be a mutually beneficial relationship between IIPL and the local Chapter.
