Visit the MFC Health Office to confidentially discuss questions or needs you have regarding your health. The MFC Health Office is not a medical office, yet it can help you with providing education on a variety of health topics including:


- Self care— How do I take care of myself?
- Immunizations— What are they all about?!
- Where to go for medical care— Are you new to Dubuque?
- What to expect & what to ask for if you have an upcoming medical appointment
- LGBTQ+ health queries
- Vaping— Isn't this healthier than smoking?
- Healthier living— What does this mean to you?
- Local medical and dental resources

Staffed by MFC Volunteer Caroline Woods. Caroline is a PA, physician assistant, who is passionate about health advocacy and providing a safe space for individuals to address their health needs. She has participated in LGBTQ+ Safe Zone & cultural-humility trainings. Her goal is to ensure that the MFC's Health Office is welcome and assuring for all.

If you are making a special trip to the Health Office, please call ahead to ensure it is staffed that day. Even if you don't speak English, we will work with you! We can try to find an interpreter or use a language translation application on a computer.

Community Meals at Hope House

We normally serve 25-35 people family-style at 6:00p at two tables and, weather permitting, an outdoor picnic table and TV trays, as needed.

Most groups arrive with the food they will serve already prepared, ready to serve immediately or with a little warm-up. You may, if you wish, however, use our gas stove or charcoal grill for cooking and our full kitchen facilities for other food preparation.

We appreciate it when groups provide beverages such as milk and/or fruit drinks/juices. Desserts are always a treat! The resident guests are always grateful for leftovers.

We normally set the tables with our dinnerware. We have an adequate number of serving bowls and utensils.

We'd appreciate it if you could stay and assist with clean-up.

We recommend that you allow time for you and other members of your group to visit with the dinner guests. We would also be very glad to lead short prayer sessions before and/or after the meal, to help you understand the spiritual significance of your hospitality.

River Museum Needs Volunteers!

We are looking for volunteers for some events this month. Events include:

Ice Fest at the River Museum Jan 14, 15, and 16th

mainly outdoor volunteering with children. There is:
>Snow shoes which is working with the kiddos to put on the shoes and instruct how to walk in them.

>Snow snake which is a native American game that comes with full instructions.

>Snow slide – which is where the children get to clime the snow hill and slide down the other side. We usually put at least two people at this area; one at the top of the snow slide hill to help the kids get on the slide safely and one at the bottom of the slide to ensure safety and to help the kids get off the sled. Our guests truly love this part as they don't need to clime the hill with their kids to have fun.

All duties outdoors run from 11am to 3pm with breaks and we provide you all with a free home-cooked meal. We have a very gracious volunteer that cooks all of the food and serves it to our demonstrators and volunteers all three days. I know this last one is short notice, yet so far it is just me and she is looking for 2-4 people and a quick response.
