Pray for the sick and lonely. Pray harder for those who will not give them comfort.

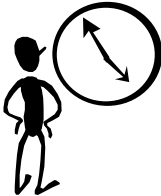
Pray for those who cry out for dignity. Pray harder for those who will not listen.

Worldwide, there are 21.3 million people who have been forced from their home countries, seeking safety and security - half of them under 18 years old. A refugee is someone who fled his or her home and country owing to "a well-founded fear of persecution because of his/her race, religion, nationality, membership in a particular social group, or political opinion", according to the United Nations 1951 Refugee Convention. Last year, the United States welcomed 85,000 refugees. June 20 has been set aside by the United Nations as a day to show public support for refugees.

Come and stand with your neighbors in Dubuque at a peaceful rally to show support of our refugee brothers and sisters on World Refugee Day and honor those who have been forced to leave their homes. Join us and hear first-hand accounts of refugees who have been settled in Iowa and from professionals who have been involved in the screening and resettlement process. You will also learn how to take legislative action and partner with local/regional organizations providing support to refugees and asylum-seekers.



As you know, we serve Community Meals, to which all are invited, on Sunday and Monday evenings at 6:00p. About 25-30 people on average share in the meal. Most of our Monday evening meals are provided by groups that do so every month. Loras College student groups generally serve the meals on Sundays, from October through April. The following Sundays and Mondays are currently available:

- August 6, 13, 30, 27, & 28

Community Meals at Hope House

We normally serve 25-35 people family-style at 6:00p at two tables and, weather permitting, an outdoor picnic table and TV trays, as needed.

Most groups arrive with the food they will serve already prepared, ready to serve immediately or with a little warm-up. You may, if you wish, however, use our gas stove or charcoal grill for cooking and our full kitchen facilities for other food preparation.

We appreciate it when groups provide beverages such as milk and/or fruit drinks/juices. Desserts are always a treat! The resident guests are always grateful for leftovers.

We normally set the tables with our dinnerware. We have an adequate number of serving bowls and utensils.

We'd appreciate it if you could stay and assist with clean-up.

We recommend that you allow time for you and other members of your group to visit with the dinner guests. We would also be very glad to lead short prayer sessions before and/or after the meal, to help you understand the spiritual significance of your hospitality.

International Day of Peace Save the Date!

The United Nations
International Day of Peace
is recognized around the

world every September 21, and Dubuque's Day of Peace Festival each year spans the two week period surrounding that date. We began in 2010 with a single event. By 2016, the festival included about 20 events, with participation from many community groups. Past keynote speakers included Rajmohan Gandhi (grandson of Mohandas K. Gandhi), Rohina Malik (Muslim actress and playwright), and Phillip Lawson (early civil rights pioneer). Our 2017 theme explores immigrants, refugees, and people whose presence in the US is questioned by some, as well as the need to take into account the indigenous perspective on these issues.

Theme for 2017

"Who Is An American?"

Jim Bear Jacobs was born in 1977 in St. Paul, MN. He is a member of the Stockbridge-Munsee Mohican Nation, an American Indian tribe located in central Wisconsin. He has degrees in Pastoral Studies and Christian Theology and has served various churches as youth minister, adult Christian educator, and director of Men's Ministries. He currently serves as an associate pastor of Church Of All Nations. He is a cultural facilitator in the Twin Cities and works to raise the public's awareness of American Indian causes and injustices. He is a convener of "Healing Minnesota Stories," a committee dedicated to creating events of dialogue and education particularly within faith communities. He presently lives in Mounds View MN, with his wife and four young children
