# Mt. Carmel BVM Remember the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Postville Raid

A decade ago, the largest single-site immigrant raid at the time in the history of the United States occurred in Postville. U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) officials raided Agriprocessors, the main producer of kosher meat in the United States. They handcuffed immigrants and bused them to the National Cattle Congress in Waterloo, Iowa.

Most detainees were charged with identity theft and sentenced to five months in prison before being deported. In a matter of hours on that day, Postville lost a significant segment of its population and hundreds of families were torn apart. Sholom Rusbashkin, owner of

Agriprocessors, was convicted and served eight years of a 27-year sentence for bank fraud. His sentence was commuted in December 2017, by President Trump.

Little has changed since 2008. The interfaith planners of the commemoration see this as a "a call to demonstrate bold resolve by championing the rights of immigrants, respecting and defending their inherent dignity, and by welcoming them and their many contributions to our society."



# Some thoughtful words from the Telegraph Herald

Gift to mosque an example of Golden Rule (TH view)

Members of local religious communities set a great example of reaching across divides to build understanding in the form of a beautiful gift. Dubuque's Catholic communities recently presented a locally made work of art to the Tri-State Islamic Center. The piece is a painted golden archway with a verse from the Quran written in Arabic inscribed along the top. The archway frames the mihrab, an alcove in the wall that is considered the holiest place in a mosque. The idea for the gift began with the Rev. Alan Dietzenbach, associate pastor at the Cathedral of St. Raphael and St. Patrick Church. He hoped the offering would be emblematic of a relationship built on mutual respect and support. The quote emblazoned on the work, arrived at in consultation with members of the Islamic faith, suggests that the purpose of having different groups of people is to get to know one another. That, according to Imam Adib Kassas, is perfectly fitting in a community with so many people of faith. It's particularly gratifying in a world where hypocrisy is rampant to see a loving example of walking faith in our local community. (TH 5-7-18)
