

We are still looking for a minimum of nine volunteers to assist with this project. Volunteers would be doing window caulking, application of window plastic, etc. and training for these tasks will be provided after our January 13, 2019 chapter meeting at Westminster Presbyterian Church, from approximately 4:30-6:30PM.

Green Iowa Americorps will be conducting the energy audits prior to the service date and volunteers will be divided into 3 groups lead by a staff member from Green lowa Americorps who will provide assistance and direction as needed. Convivium Urban Farmstead

Learn to Compost!!

Join Convivium Urban Farmstead and Dubuque Metropolitan Area Solid Waste Agency (DMASWA) in a

project to measure and minimize food waste in Dubuque, Iowa. Our four week composting class, instructed by Convivium's Farm Manager, A.J. Shultz, will teach you how to turn your kitchen scraps and yard waste into fertile compost. As a participant, you will:

- gain an in-depth knowledge of the compost ecosystem and outdoor composting basics
- build and take home a dual compartment outdoor compost bin
- build and take home a kitchen scrap countertop collector
- learn about vermicomposting and take home a worm bin
- be connected to a network of past class participants and Convivium staff who will provide support and advice during and after the completion of the program
- be reimbursed your \$40 class deposit upon submission of your food waste log

In order to successfully measure our impact, participants will be expected to:

- attend all four Complete Composting class sessions
- utilize your dual compartment outdoor compost bin or vermicompost bin
- measure and record the amount of food waste you compost for three months after completion of the class (scales will be provided)
- submit your food waste log to Convivium and receive your \$40 deposit back!

Sign up now to be a part of this group effort to create a culture of composting here in Dubuque!

There are only 20 slots available between two class sessions: January 23 - February 13 and March 27 -April 17. Classes will be held Wednesday evenings.

*the \$40 class deposit will be returned to you upon submission of your food waste log, recording the weight of composted material for three months.
