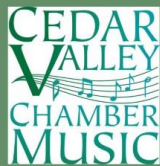

Trinitas Chamber Ensemble, a trio from St. John's, Newfoundland, will perform at St. Luke's Methodist Church in downtown Dubuque at 7:00 on July 15. The concert will be an outreach of the 2019 Cedar Valley Chamber Music Festival, which brings professional musicians from throughout the US and Canada to the Waterloo/Cedar Falls Area each year for two weeks of intensive rehearsals and performances.

Trinitas stretches the boundaries of classical chamber music, introducing jazz, tango, and popular idioms to create engaging, off-beat performances. Trinitas premiered in Toronto in June of 2015, and has since inspired rave audience reactions in Washington DC, Ontario, British Columbia, Alberta, and Newfoundland. Members include Michelle Cheramy (flute), Nathan Cook (cello), and Phil Roberts (piano). They make their home in and around St. John's, Newfoundland, where they teach and perform. Accomplished soloists in their own right, they have performed around the world, including in St. Petersburg (Russia), Llangollen (Wales), Uberlândia (Brazil), and Tegucigalpa (Honduras).

The program will consist of a compilation of music from Trinitas' upcoming CD, "Throwing Caution to the Wind," due out later this year. Works will include trios by American composer Lowell Liebermann, Russian composer Nikolai Kapustin, and Canadian composer David McIntyre.

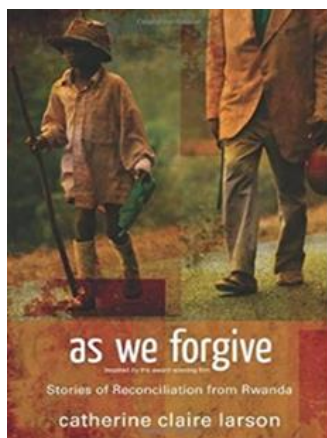
