Local US Census Recruiter Linda Stovall says that due to the COVID 19 emergency, the US Census is sill hiring workers through **July 31**. The wage is \$21.00 per hour. mileage is .575 cents a mile. It is between 15-20 hours a week and works with your schedule. You will be provided mask and gloves. The services of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul of Dubuque are open to all people in need regardless of their income, religious beliefs, race, or sexual orientation.


