The Dubuque Food Pantry is here to serve you and your family, friends, and neighbors. In these trying times, know that we are here to help.





Pause: A Season to Breathe (via Zoom)

Like the seasons of the Earth that shift and change in nature, our lives of faith are also cyclical and invite us to

### **Dubuque Interfaith Green Coalition**

Friends.

This is an invite from your neighbors, not some organization seeking funds from afar, not some organization seeking to enlist you to the exclusion of all other activities. We ARE, however, as a Dubuque organization, seeking to invite you in a truly global cause!

With the New Year (2020 thankfully behind us), and as 2021 progresses with the rollout of COVID-19 vaccines, we at the Dubuque Interfaith Green Coalition (DIGC) are looking forward to a year of increasing attention to one of the three most critical issues facing our world. Certainly, the COVID-19 infection is one, as is the crisis in our democracy (from whatever viewpoint you take). But most (98%) of scientists agree that the climate crisis is so critical for our planet that we will see its effects, and may have already experienced some of those.

So, what can a person of faith do? The answer is that a person of faith, in 'congregation' with others, can do much. The DIGC is a chapter of Iowa Interfaith Power and Light (IIPL) organization which, in turn, is a part of the national Interfaith Power and Light (IPL). IPL is not a producer of power and light, but an organization dedicated to addressing the issues of climate change in a matter that will ensure 'power' and 'light' for all future generations and for all living on our endangered planet. DIGC, in turn, has three goals for 2021. The first is encouraging congregations and groups of other persons of faith to make a specific address to these issues and, in particular, forming 'green teams' to do so'. We have access to programs for individual congregations to assess their 'carbon footprint', to make changes to reduce that 'footprint', to encourage members of those congregations to assess and reduce their own footprint, and to join with others of faith in bringing our society and especially our local communities into a better relationship with our endangered planet.

The second is encouraging organizations not usually considered as 'churches' or 'congregations' to join with us. IPL was originally designed for worshiping congregations, and that still is at the core. But particularly in Dubuque, we have many people of faith in other 'formations' than 'church congregations'. There are many in religious orders as well as institutions of learning which embody a 'community' able to join in this process.

The third is a specific aim to bring our society, and, again in particular, our communities into compliance with a 'zero waste' standard. We have several members working assiduously on this as well.

My invitation to YOU is to join with us. We have monthly meetings, currently on the Zoom platform, on the second Sunday of the month at 3 pm. IIPL and Westminster Presbyterian have made their Zoom platforms available to us as have member individuals. We hope to use the

IIPL platform this coming Sunday and will be glad to provide you with the link if you respond to me with your interest.

Without you, without all people of faith working together, the avarice which has led us to this crisis in climate will continue unabated. But with you and all of us working together, we can present to our God (however you and your congregation envision God) an earth improving in health as we together begin to improve our "COVID-19 health". Please join us and let me know of your need for the link!

### Green Team Tip - Go Green in 2021!

Among your New Year's resolutions please consider doing more to care for God's creation by going green this year. You can probably do much more than you think you can. There are many simple and easy things we all can do for our planet. WPC will be offering a few Green Tips each month!

### **Green Team Tip - Light Bulbs**

Change your light bulbs! Changing just one of the light bulbs in your home to an LED light bulb could make a serious impact on your energy consumption and your electric bill. Imagine what could happen if you change them all!

### **Green Team Tip - Clothes Washing and Drying**

When washing clothing, make sure that you use cold water or warm water. Using hot water will take the washing machine longer to fill while consuming more water and using more energy. Also, use less energy by hang drying your clothes rather than using the dryer.

### **Green Team Tip – Save Water**

Make it a point to check for and repair leaky faucets and toilets in your home. Even a small leak can waste a lot of water over time and cost you on your water bill. You can also reduce the amount of water used for a bath in the tub or reduce the time you take in the shower. Don't rinse dishes before putting them in the dishwasher.

### **Green Team Tip - Save Electricity**

Turn off lights when they are not needed or not being used. Turn off or unplug electric appliances and electronics when they are not being used. This alone

can greatly reduce energy costs. Turn off computers and other electronics at night. Even when they are on energy saving mode they are using a lot of energy.
