

Health Care for Kids!

Even when life is a little uncertain, kids still need to see their doctor for routine care. Routine well-child visits help pediatricians determine if kids are meeting important developmental milestones and give ageappropriate immunizations. Families should contact their health care provider and schedule an appointment to catch up on missed visits and vaccinations. Many uninsured children may be eligible for free or lowcost health insurance through Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (Hawki). Eligibility is dependent on household size and income. A family of 4 earning up to \$80, 030/ year may qualify for Hawki. For children and teens, age 0-18, routine care including check-ups, vaccines, dental cleanings, and eye exams are covered. Enrollment in Medicaid and Hawki is open

Dubuque Trees Forever

Hello Tree Enthusiasts

Now that we've done our spring plantings, it is time to focus on tree care. Here is another volunteer opportunity for you. We will be holding a "Mulching Party" on the Bee Branch on Saturday, July 17. I call it a party because the trees will celebrate having this new mulch to keep them cool, keep weeds down and keep them safe from mowers and weed whips. We will be working from Garfield to 24th St. There will be a pile of mulch delivered to each end of this section of the Bee Branch. We will need 3 groups of people:

- 1) The first group will arrive at 8am. It should be people with some gardening experience. We will train them to trim sucker shoots and pull any large weeds and get trees prepared for mulch. They will start at each end and meet in the middle to make sure we get them all.
- 2) The second group will arrive for training at 8:15. They will take wagons full of mulch and deliver a set amount to each tree. These volunteers will need to bring a scoop shovel (or other shovel) and/or a mulch rake. There are 8-10 wagons and we will work in small teams of 2-3 people. We will start some on each end and work to the middle.
- 3) The 3rd group will arrive for training at 8:30. This group will work in small teams of 2-3 to actually spread the mulch at each tree. We will train to make sure you only have 2-3" deep, don't touch the trunk and don't have "mulch volcanoes!"


