Dubuque Rescue Mission

All is well at the Mission. We continue to hover around capacity for the men's third-floor dormitory. All meals continue to be "to go" except for the elderly and handicapped who can sit down at one of the 8 ft. socially distance tables. We are serving around 200 men, women, and children a day. The two Thrift Stores continue to do business with retail sales and donations to those who cannot afford clothes or other household items. We're hoping to get the mobile food trailer up and running sometime in April - depending on weather. We would begin by serving the Sunday evening meals at Hope House at 6 p.m. From there, we will discern where the gaps are in free meal services and provide accordingly. We are moving forward on a shower room in the basement Covid shelter and possibly beginning some renovations of the Men's Third Floor Dormitory – waiting on news about a grant for that. That's it for now. Can't wait to get beyond the pandemic and begin meeting in person.

At the last Board meeting, it was also reported that the Mulgrew Foundation has provided a \$30,000 donation.



A Conversation With Susan Hendershot

Join <u>lowa Interfaith Power & Light</u> and the <u>Dubuque Interfaith Green Coalition</u> for a conversation with <u>Interfaith Power & Light</u> President Susan Hendershot on **Sunday, March 14th at 3pm using Zoom**. Rev. Hendershot will speak on IPL's federal policy strategy for 2021 as well as coordinated work being done with other faith-based organizations. A panel from the Dubuque Interfaith Green Coalition will ask a few questions, followed by Q&As as time permits.

Rev. Susan Hendershot has served as the President of Interfaith Power & Light since 2018, and is based in Washington, D.C. Prior to this role she served for seven years as the Executive Director at Iowa Interfaith Power & Light. Rev. Hendershot is ordained in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) with an M. Div. from Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, a B.A. from Bethany

College in Bethany, West Virginia, and a certificate in Spiritual Direction. Rev. Hendershot has served as a pastor in both Disciples of Christ and United Methodist congregations, focusing on social justice ministries. She also served as the first Heartland Field Organizer for the ONE Campaign on global poverty. Currently Rev. Hendershot serves as co-chair of the Executive Committee for the RE-AMP Steering Committee, a network of more than 150 climate, energy, and environmental organizations throughout the Midwest. Rev. Hendershot believes that climate change is a moral issue, disproportionately impacting those who are most vulnerable in our world. She gets her motivation and inspiration from her two sons.
