On Thursday March 31st, DACU alongside St. Peter Lutheran Church, provided an opportunity for all faiths to show support in Love and Light for the victims of this horrible war in Ukraine. During the day, individual prayers were heard from many folks in our community. The bell was tolled on the hour. Candles were lit lifting up those prayers.

At 6:30 pm over 100 people the Faith Community gathered for a time of worship and prayer. Folks from the Islamic Community and the Jewish Community gathered with us. We heard prayers in support of peace, care for all who are and have been affected by this war.

The service ended in a candle light vigil, singing the last hymn together, using our Light to Light a Candle for those in Ukraine and those helping in this time of great need. We left the worship space with our candles lit showing solidarity in Light and Love and the church bell tolling.

Special thanks to St. Peter Lutheran Church (ELCA) for hosting and Pastor Karla Wildberger and DACU for organizing this time together.

We encourage the faith community to continue to lift up prayers for the intervention of peace, hope, and justice in the Ukraine and throughout the world.

DUBUQUE RESCUE MISSION

We have been serving about 200 men, women and children a day in our "Free Meal" ministry. Our men's third floor dormitory is currently full and we just closed our "Warming Center" which was our dining hall for 12 additional homeless men. That temporary emergency shelter was opened from November of last year to this first week of April when we just closed it. The Transitional Houses at 25th and Elm continue to be a success for the men who transition from the Mission, have employment and now currently live at one of the Transitional Houses.

Our Thrift Stores continue to provide free clothing and other house hold items to those who are poor. Additionally, we depend on the donations of furniture and other house hold items from you, our supporters. Please share the word that we are always in need of good, lightly used furniture and household items such as laundry detergent, twin bed sheets, bath towels, and washcloths.

Our commercial greenhouse is in full swing with seed starts and other vegetable items and work on the outside gardens has just begun.

Again, we thank all our supporters and ask for your prayers as we continue to serve the men, women and children who come to us in need. Your prayers and volunteer support are essential as well.

MANY FAMILIES IN THE COMMUNITY STRUGGLE TO PAY HIGH PREMIUMS FOR HEALTH AND DENTAL COVERAGE.

- Hawki insurance provides health and dental coverage for children up to the age of 18 who do not financially qualify for Medicaid, but may meet other income guidelines.
- Guidelines are based on household size and income, and many working families may qualify. For example, a family of 4 can make up to \$80,030/year and qualify for Hawki coverage.
- Cristee' Miner is the new Hawki Outreach Coordinator for the VNA and is ready to assist with questions or the application process.
- Hawki premiums continue to be waived, and disenrollments are no longer in effect while the public health emergency is in place.
