Awakening the Dreamer: Changing the Dream To celebrate Earth Day, a Symposium to help tri-state area residents respond to global issues such as climate change: Sinsinawa Mound 1-5 p.m. Saturday, April 24.

This is an opportunity for everyone to understand what is happening and to consider how we can all play a part in addressing these problems and creating a world that works sustainably for us and for future generations.

Participants will explore our culture and how this contributes to these problems in a workshop that uses inspiring video, up-to-the-minute facts and dynamic group interaction. We'll hear from some of the world's leading experts on topics as diverse as the current state of the Earth\*s biodiversity and the reality of the socio-economic disparity throughout the world.

This is a unique opportunity to share your concerns about the state of the world with like-minded members of your community and offer support to each other in taking steps to effect the changes that you wish to see. Facilitators for this symposium are Sisters Colleen Settles, OP, and June Wilkerson, OP. The two were trained to be presenters and have led the symposium in Los Angeles, Minneapolis and Chicago. They will lead the event at Sinsinawa Mound in April, and later in Spokane and Madison.

Sister Colleen sees her role as a symposium facilitator as her "volunteerism for the world." Reflecting on the future health of our planet and its people, she said, "This

is one of the most important issues that we as a world community are facing, and that is greatly impacted by the way we see the world and how we connect with our own spirituality-this symposium brings that front and center. It helps us to examine our unexamined consumption. Every person has a role to play in the future of a sustainable world. We cannot continue in the dream we are living now."

Participants will leave the Symposium empowered to take clear steps to embody their vision for a better world, and having established new connections to work with others on common issues.
